

# Ozzy-400 shows export potential

"We've gone bananas", the perpetual slogan for IBS Engineering Supplies, may soon take on a totally new meaning. The Ozzy-400 (a four-wheel-drive, all weather, all terrain, power ladder) could soon be heading for overseas markets.

According to managing director of IBS Engineering Supplies Bill Seawright, the Ozzy-400 was mainly designed in conjunction with the banana in-

dustry for its conditions, however, there is also a future for this type of equipment in the rare fruit and papaw industries.

"We are already running into production difficulties with the enormous demand for our Ozzy-400 and orders are now being taken for delivery in late February early March," he said.

"Our suppliers for most of the components in the Ozzy-400 are running short on sup-

ply, for example another 18 Perkins engines have just been ordered from England and should arrive here late December.

"The demand for this particular product has outweighed our expectations and we are currently looking at improving our production line and probably in employing more trades person.

"Our main aim here at IBS

Engineering Supplies is still to manufacture machinery that is not only of top quality but is also backed by our extensive service guarantee."
